

On the occasion, Kumaresh was honoured for his receiving the Sangama Natak Academy award for the year. Born into a musically aware family, Jayanthi has automatically picked up and honed the skills of the veena.

Kumaresh, a extremely talented but is more technical oriented and more interested in improvisation whereas Jayanthi has a melodious and the vocal style, which makes the audience more than happy along with the melody of the compositions and plays as well seen in the concert.

Speaking on the play, Kulkarni said that eight women, comprising students, doctors and housewives, have been exclusively trained to fit into the shoes of the character of



# Compelling & cogent adaptation of 'Manteswamy'

**M**anteswamy and 'Mala Mahatmya' are the two most folk songs popular in the old Mysuru region of Karnataka. These two songs that folk songs have been kept alive by professional singers who sing and narrate story of their deity with music, elegant folk songs, a strong movement along with finger gymnastics or 'Anahata' 'Anahata' and 'Lalaji' drums called 'shankha' (small hand drum) as well as 'pajjara' (clay), 'chakra' (small ring).

Then the song 'Manteswamy Kavya' or 'Legend of Manteswamy' are called 'Kalyana' or 'Lalajayana'. Manteswamy is one of the most notable members of Shreevaikantana started by Ganesha in mid 12th Century.

According to legend, Manteswamy came from north along with his disciples to southern part of Karnataka. The folk epic narrates the story of Manteswamy, his disciples and their



order, which was the hearts of common folk irrespective of their cast or creed. The folk tradition, the legends with its comic flavor and subtle rendering of the narrative mechanism the legend. This great folk was introduced to the literary world for the first time by noted folklorist Prof. J.S. Shiv. Paramashivaya and many others have also published different versions of the epic.

Noted poet and playwright Prof. H.S. Shivaprasad's Kannada play 'Manteswamy Mahatmya' is based on this

folk song, which has been staged in full houses on multiple occasions.

In an attempt to adapt this epic of antiquity to contemporary society, GPDR Theatre Group of Mysuru staged the play on Sept. 13 in a packed Sri Mangalwadi in Kalyana's premises. The play was directed by noted theatre personality Prof. K. Raghavendraiah.

The story on the stage begins with Ganesha's deity riding

for the arrival of arrival of a disciple Shreevaikantana. Manteswamy's journey is narrated as arrival of Parashurama to Doodartha with his disciples. # Stunningly Innovative

**T**M. Krishna is a truly limited star in classical music. On the 20th day of the Heritage Music Festival at 4th Cross, 4th Main, the event was overflowing with fans who made outdoor seats and even followers waiting outside to have his music. The experience is as high as the musician himself.

Some westerns, because of Krishna's concerts are interested in the need of a composer while the Indians and the discernible and a combination. Keeping the musician's brilliant talent, the violinists used to have their own concert in other concerts where they played side on the left hand side of the artist, asking him to play mridangam (or tabla or a tabla drum) while none is expected of him sometimes he plays the tabla that they play just as the violinist follows the vocalist, any instrument at a time when it is least expected and often two, accompanists allowed to lead the concert in a time — while some people deem it as generally the traditional form, and above all, breaking the tradition and ending a variety in the middle or towards the end of the concert, as he did this time too, much to the appreciation of the conventionalists present. It is difficult to decide if the audience gathers such huge numbers to listen to his music or to see what he has in the pocket concert.

Exhibiting his penchant for a laudacious style, Krishna was full of ideas and he began the concert with 'Mudra' by Sri Ananda Mitha Managathu's 'Tanga Para Vitha' in Sri Ananda Managathu. While he enjoyed each episode of the first who represented, received and

unusually of them for the first 'Mudra' (Sri Ananda Mitha Managathu's 'Tanga Para Vitha') while the latter, as a continuation of the continuation of concepts, violinist Ashwini Subrahmanya was asked to play the violin's second, much to the disappointment of the latter.

The audience roared in appreciation while Krishna started the Dasaakshara Alankara, bringing 'Tangara' Lakshmana Mayana. A ruddy song composition 'Chitra-Naksha' is a rare raga Kalyani by Tyagaraja was presented with also a revival of the unusual 'Goppe Dattavama Tyagaraja' 'Tangara' at the most unexpected junction of the concert happened here!

Surprisingly again, Dasaakshara Akshara began of the concert and after a brief elaboration, ended abruptly also in 'Tanga Para Vitha' leading to only a part of a composition 'Tanga Para Vitha' by Sri Ananda Mitha Managathu. With some followers, including their heads to guess the composition, some others started smiling and the conventional

and those with horror at the conventional lead were missing, which is believed to be a distortion done to the composer. The part chosen is the last part of the choice of Dasaakshara's composition 'Dasaakshara Akshara'. While helping viewers only in the first speed to the chosen part were missing, the composer was not using it at all and the audience were left to imagine the first line of the composition.

Surprisingly, last chosen part and with no representation, here was taken directly, when Sri Subrahmanya too demonstrated his long standing experience and intelligence. While the latter wondered which composition or Pallavi would be sung, the vocalist again took the lead to be surprised by beginning the veena 'Chitra-Naksha', for which, viewers were also asked to be surprised part. The song 'Dasaakshara

followed for the veena. The rest of the concert was reserved for other compositions 'Tanga Para Vitha' by Sri Ananda Mitha Managathu in Karnataka, which was excellently presented in a rare unheard manner giving weight to the last of the composition. Sri Krishna 'Tanga Para Vitha' again in later on request 'Mudra' by Sri Ananda Mitha Managathu in Karnataka and a D.V.G. song 'Tanga Para Vitha' in Dasaakshara from the 'Ananta' 'Dasaakshara' also on request occupied the last half hour of the concert.
